Each oral presentation is marked out of 15 points. In Phase 1, it is worth 5% of your grade in the course *only if you opt to include it*. In Phase 2, it is worth 15% of your grade in the course *unless you have opted to include your grade from Phase 1, in which case it is worth 10%*.

Phase 1 parameters: 10 minutes on the capabilities and limitations of your tool for analyzing *Hamlet* 3.4.

Phase 2 parameters: 20 minutes on the comparative and unique capabilities of all five tools for analyzing your act of *Hamlet*.

Presentation (10 pts)	Presentation was organized, clear, and succinct. It fulfilled all the parameters of each phase, and described your <i>process</i> well. It was clear what role your/each tool played in your interpretation. You focused on both its/their capabilities and limitations. If supporting materials (<i>not required</i>) were used, they were used effectively to support the presentation's goals.	Presentation was relatively well organized, but timing was too long or too short. It fell short of fulfilling the parameters . The role of your/some tool(s) in your interpretation was unclear. You focused too much on either capabilities or limitations. Supporting materials were distracting or time-consuming at the expense of the presentation's goals.	Presentation did not flow logically and was difficult to follow. It failed to fulfill the parameters . Your/some tool(s) felt irrelevant or peripheral to your analysis. Supporting materials were used inappropriately, and should have been omitted.

Group Dynamics (5 pts)	Each member of the team spoke, and it was clear that each had made a <i>discrete</i> contribution to the project. Team members treated one another with respect.	Some team members were silent, or their contributions seemed too similar to others' contributions. Team members mostly treated one another with respect—but some ignored, interrupted, or undermined others.	Presentation was seriously unbalanced so that one or two members spoke the whole time. Some team members seem to be freeloading. Team members showed little respect for one another.
